Train leaving station for first time in 2006

FRENCH LICK – The Indiana Railway Museum is firing up its locomotive for the upcoming 2006 season with a 12:45 p.m. special departure from the Old Monon Depot on March 11. The 20-mile round-trip will transport passengers through parts of the Hoosier National Forest and the one-half-mile-long Burton Tunnel, the second longest tunnel in the state. The narrated ride will also take passengers past several local historic sites.

There will be a brief layover for passengers to stretch their legs at the halfway point of the trip in the small town of Cuzco. A cash snack bar will be available on the train the duration of the trip. The Indiana Railway Museum's two-hour trek through Orange and Dubois Counties has been an important part of Orange County tourism since 1978. Each year more than 20,000 visitors ride the train.
