### **Indian Summer Festival to be Held at Jay-Cee Park**

PAOLI, Ind. - Committee members are working hard in anticipation of the upcoming Indian Summer Festival scheduled for Friday, September 22, 6-10 p.m. and Saturday, September 23, 9 a.m.-10 p.m. at Jay-Cee Park.
